- 5. have excellent familiarity with phonetic segmentation and annotation of audio recordings,
- 6. have native or near-native competence in Polish and English, and working knowledge of other foreign languages (preferably Norwegian),
- 7. have a good knowledge of statistics and experience of working with new statistical tools, e.g. R software,
- 8. have a well-documented publication record,
- 9. be able to collaborate in an interdisciplinary research team,
- 10. be conscientious, enthusiastic, creative and well organized.

Additionally, the following assets are welcome:

- 1. broader interest in other linguistic domains (e.g. syntax and/or neurolinguistics),
- 2. familiarity with multilingual acquisition contexts,
- 3. experience in conducting research involving multilingual participants.

# Scope of responsibilities

The scholar to be hired as a postdoctoral researcher at AMU will have the following range of tasks:

- 1. Collaborating with the PI on research design, data collection and data analysis.
- 2. Paying research visits to the Norwegian partner institutions to consult research design, the collection of phonological/syntactic/neurophysiological data and collaborative data analysis.
- 3. Managing participants' recruitment process and data collection in Poland and Norway.
- 4. Being responsible for the analysis of the phonological data.
- 5. Involvement in the dissemination of results via conference presentations and journal publications.
- 6. Participation in the preparation of conference presentations and writing up papers.
- 7. Being responsible for project data management.
- 8. Being responsible for the co-creation of a multilingual speech corpus.
- 9. Assisting in administration of the project website.
- 10. Participation in the organization of workshops and other events in the project.
- 11. Carrying out other project-related tasks suggested by the PI.

Project title: Cross-linguistic influence in multilingualism across domains: Phonology and syntax (UMO-2020/37/B/HS2/00617)

Project description: The project scope is to investigate cross-linguistic influence in multilingual acquisition across linguistic domains, focusing on the role of different settings and stages of acquisition. The project aims to shed further light on the complexity of the acquisition of the third language (L3A), understood as an additional foreign language after previously acquiring a first foreign language, by juxtaposing initial stages vs. advanced learners acquiring their third/additional language in a naturalistic vs. formal setting. Specifically, it will explore the phenomenon of cross-linguistic influence in multilingual acquisition across different language domains, including phonology and syntax. The planned project is innovative in its comprehensive scope as previous studies in this area have focused exclusively on one of the selected settings or acquisition stages. It embraces an interdisciplinary perspective by bringing together experts in multilingual acquisition from Adam Mickiewicz University in Poznań and the Arctic University of Norway (UiT) in Tromsø and/or NTNU in Trondheim, representing different language domains to bridge the existing gap. Further, it will employ a range of methodologies, including behavioural tasks and on-line methods of brain imaging (EEG). The languages under investigation involve Polish, Norwegian and English. The selected focal areas of investigation will include: for morpho-syntax: reflexive possessives, pronoun binding, word order (V2, object shift, etc.), gender, SV agreement; for phonology: the perception and production of vowels (with emphasis on rounding) and retroflex consonants across Polish, English and Norwegian phonological systems. Naturalistic acquirers of L3 Norwegian will be

recruited in Tromsø and/or Trondheim (i.e. native Poles with some knowledge of English as their L2), while formal learners of L3 Norwegian will be recruited in Poznań. Due to its originality and comprehensive nature, the project is expected to make a significant contribution to the development of science through deepening our understanding of the complexity of third language acquisition, processing and use. We offer work in a dynamic research team conducting the project in an international cooperation.
