3. Your personal data shall be processed in order to:

- a. carrying out and participating in the recruitment process for the position indicated in the advertisement,
- b. to carry out and participate in further recruitment processes for the same position or a position corresponding to your qualifications or experience,
- c. to establish, assert or defend against claims.

(4) The basis for the processing of your personal data is Article 6(1)(a), (b), (c), (e), (f) and Article 9(2)(a), (f), (j) of the Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (General Data Protection Regulation) of 27 April 2016.
