- Curriculum Vitae;
- Diplomas or certificates issued by universities confirming the education and the degrees or academic titles held (for degrees obtained outside the country, documents must meet the equivalence criteria set out in Article 328 of the Law on Higher Education and Science of 20th July 2018 (Journal of Laws of 2023, item 742, as amended);
- Information on research, teaching and organisational achievements, which should include:
- 1) Scholarly output (with particular emphasis on achievements in research on 19th century literature and culture):
- a) publications (monographs and peer-reviewed articles, edits and co-edits, translations from English or other foreign languages),
- b) participation in national and international conferences (with the paper),
- c) grants (leader, contractor),
- d) current membership in editorial committees of journals and publishing series,
- e) foreign and domestic scientific internships (place, type of internship, objectives, results),
- f) awards for scientific activities.
- 2) Organisational activities: the organisation of conferences and events of a scientific and cultural nature. Cooperation with national and international centres and institutions.
- 3) Teaching activities:
- a) teaching activities (type of classes taught, topics and content of education, list of classes taught in foreign languages),
- b) development of study programmes/specialisations,
- c) awards for teaching activities.
- Other documents determined by the selection board: Plans for further scientific and teaching development.
- Popularisation activities: popular science publications, organising and conducting events which are aimed at popularising media and culture.

The Assistant Professor at the Institute of Polish Philology of the The Faculty of Polish and Classical Philology

- specialisation in Polish literary studies.

The holder of the post of Assistant Professor will be obliged to conduct individual research and work in research teams, to publish scientific works resulting from them, and to participate in scientific conferences at within the country and abroad. The teaching load will include classes related to the teaching of the history of Polish and European literature with particular emphasis on Romantic literature, as well as undergraduate seminars and optional classes related to the above specialisation in Polish. Moreover, the candidate hired is expected to take an active part in organisational work at both faculty and institute level, as well as within the department where the candidate will be employed.

II) Requirements and qualifications

The contest is open to candidates who meet the requirements set out in Article 113 of the Law on Higher Education and Science of 20 July 2018 (Journal of Laws of 2023, item 742, i.e.) and who meet the following requirements:

1. Completed studies in Polish philology, doctoral degree in literary studies,

Proven scientific, teaching and organisational achievements in research institutes or higher education,
Proven qualifications in the field of the history of Polish literature of the 19th century, especially in the area of research on Romantic literature and culture, confirmed by publications or other documented forms of scientific activity. In justified situations, the selection board reserves the right to request additional external reviews of the candidates' achievements and/or additional documents to assess their qualifications.

III) Languages requirements

Polish - native English (fluent) – allowing to conduct lectures in this language

IV) Required research, research and teaching or teaching experience

- the contest is open to candidates holding a master's degree in Polish philology and a doctoral degree in the discipline of literary studies, specialising in the history of Polish literature of the 19th century;

- research output and teaching experience will be assessed by the selection board in proportion to the length of professional experience, thus levelling the playing field between candidates with a recent doctoral degree and those already in academic positions. Any gaps in the academic curriculum vitae will not have a negative impact on the evaluation.

VI) Qualification criteria

a. Research experience: number and quality of previous scientific publications and other scientific

achievements (participation in national and international scientific conferences, grants, participation in research projects, internships, awards, etc.).

- b. Teaching experience consistent with the teaching needs of the courses offered in the Faculty of Polish and Classical Philology.
- c. Organisational experience: organisation of scientific and popularisation events, work in scientific teams.
- d. Planned activities in the field of internationalisation of research (planned grant applications, research projects, publications in languages other than Polish).
- e. Documented knowledge of English or certification of teaching in this language.

VII) The selection process

- a. The commencement of the work of the selection board no later than 14 days after the deadline for the submission of the application documents.
- b. A formal assessment of the submitted applications.
- c. In the event that the required documents are missing, call for completion of the documentation or provision of additional documents.
- d. The selection of candidates for the interview stage.
- e. An interview with the shortlisted candidates.
- f. The selection board has the right to request external reviews of the candidates' achievements or to ask the candidates to conduct teaching activities in Polish and English with the possibility of their evaluation by students.
- g. The announcement of the results by the chairperson of the selection board and notification to candidates of the outcome of the competition. The information will include a justification and an indication of the strengths and weaknesses of the candidates. The candidates will receive their submitted documents together with the above mentioned information.

VIII) Professional development prospects

The post holder will have the opportunity of:

- carrying out research related work, both individual and collaborative (including projects conducted at the Institute of Polish Philology,
- cooperating with researchers from the Institute of Polish Philology at the University of Adam Mickiewicz as well as with their domestic and foreign partners,
- consulting the progress of the research work being carried out during scientific meetings and conferences organised at the Institute of Polish Philology,
 - having access to scientific development (obtaining habilitation and subsequent professional promotions),
- improving teaching competences through participation in workshops and training courses held at the University of Adam Mickiewicz,
