Requirements:

- PhD in Political Science/Social Communication and Media Studies/Sociology/ Psychology or in a directly related field.
- Strong knowledge of research methods and techniques in both qualitative and quantitative research approaches.
- Familiarity with the concepts and theories related to democratic recession, civil society development, political participation, and democratic innovations.
- Demonstrated experience in conducting research (preferably in the context of Central Eastern European countries)
- Proven track record of academic publications, with a focus on political science/communication/sociology/psychology or a directly related field.
- Excellent analytical and critical thinking skills to contribute to theoretical and empirical perspectives.
- Strong written and verbal communication skills in English and preferable also in Polish.
- Experience with working in an international environment will be highly appreciated;
- Contacts or ability to interact with practitioners (organizers of the citizens'
 assemblies) and local decision-makers in Central and Eastern European countries will
 be highly appreciated.
- Ability to work independently as well as collaboratively in a multidisciplinary research team.
- Attention to detail and ability to manage multiple tasks and meet deadlines.

Description of tasks:

A post-doc position is offered as part of the NCN Sonata Bis project: "Deliberative Innovations in Central and Eastern Europe - a panacea for democracy in crisis? (DelibDemCEE). " The aim of the project is to analyze and evaluate selected forms of deliberative democracy in the countries of Central and Eastern Europe and to find answers to the questions whether they contribute to the improvement of democracy and greater involvement of citizens. Research goals will be achieved by studying citizens' assemblies organized in Poland, the Czech Republic, Slovakia and Hungary but also in other post-communist countries, such as Estonia, Latvia, Romania, Macedonia, and Georgia. Investigating the ways in which deliberative innovations affect democracy during its crisis — either through citizen engagement or shaping public opinion, or by directly influencing the political system — will require a variety of research methods, both qualitative and quantitative.

As a Post-Doctoral Researcher, you will be responsible for:

- 1. Preparing Research Designs:
 - Develop research designs for research papers within the three work packages of the project.
 - Design and implement suitable research methodologies.
 - Collaborate with the research team to ensure the integration of qualitative and quantitative approaches in the research designs.
 - Ensure ethical considerations and data protection protocols are followed throughout the research process.
- 2. Conducting Research and Analysis:
 - Collect and analyze data using the prescribed research methodologies.
 - Collaborate with team members in data collection, data cleaning, and data management processes.
 - Conduct statistical analysis and/or qualitative data analysis to address the research questions
 - Interpret research findings and contribute to academic publications and reports.
 - Prepare and submit single or co-authored articles to reputable peer-reviewed journals, based on the research conducted within the project.
- 3. Collaborative Teamwork:
 - Engage in regular research meetings and discussions with the research team to share progress, insights, and challenges.
 - Collaborate with team members on joint research activities, including data analysis, report writing, and project deliverables.
 - Collaborate with the research team to ensure the dissemination of research findings through academic conferences and workshops.
- 4. Project Support:
 - Assist in project-related administrative tasks, such as organizing meetings, managing project documentation, and liaising with project partners.
 - Contribute to the development of funding proposals and research grant applications for future projects.

List of required documents:

- Cover letter expressing your interest and highlighting your relevant qualifications.
- Curriculum vitae detailing your academic background, research experience, and publication record.
- A document confirming obtaining a doctoral degree.

Shortlisted candidates will be contacted for an interview. Qualification process period: from October 24th to November 7th, 2025 (the interview must take place within this timeframe). During the interview, candidates will be asked to present their current scientific and practical achievements that fit the purpose of the project. The interview will be conducted in English. We anticipate the position to start January 2026.
