Subject: Interpretation of Luboń's industrial heritage for the purposes of tourism in the perspective of the experience of industrial facilities of the Technical Monuments Route of the Silesian Province and Technoroute (*orig. Technotrasa*)

The doctoral thesis deals with the interpretation of industrial heritage with a view to industrial heritage tourism, based on specific examples from the Silesian and Moravian-Silesian Provinces in the Czech Republic and referring them to the case of Luboń near Poznań. Its cognitive objectives include the identification of diverse, good practices encountered in industrial heritage tourism in terms of its interpretation contexts, its accessibility and the media used in its programmes, the identification and inventory of Luboń's industrial heritage resources, and the documentation of selected elements of the industrial past of the city near Poznań and the development of proposals for their interpretation. In the methodological aspect, the aim of the study is to synthesise concepts and research approaches applied to industrial heritage that can be used in interdisciplinary research, on the border of history and geography.

Methods used in the research include a literature review, a landscape analysis and interpretation method and an inventory referring first to post-industrial facilities on industrial and technical routes, and then to industrial facilities in Luboń. The thesis has an application dimension, therefore its conclusions indicate the proposed directions of interpretation of Luboń's industrial heritage for the purposes of tourism.
